Traveling Gavel

Greeneville Lodge No. 3 is the current home of the Tennessee State Traveling Gavel.

It has been a long tradition among Masonic bodies to have a traveling gavel, trowel, etc. that promotes visitation among lodges in counties and districts. "Old Hickory," as the gavel is known, was designed to promote visitation across the entire state.

"The goal is to move the Tennessee Traveling Gavel across the state of Tennessee as quickly as possible and to encourage Masons to travel and fellowship with our Masonic brothers across the state."

The 10-inch gavel was hand crafted by Brother Robert Hyde, using hickory from the grounds of The Hermitage, home of Brother Andrew Jackson, two-time Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Tennessee and seventh President of the United States. It is fitting that Greeneville host the gavel for a while because it is a documented fact that Jackson was a regular visitor of Greeneville Lodge No. 3 when he was in the area.

There is a book that goes along with the gavel. When a lodge comes into its possession, the dates are recorded, entries are made, and the lodge seal is affixed to certify where Old Hickory has been.

Greeneville Lodge No. 3 is the 59th lodge – including the Grand Lodge – to hold possession of the Tennessee State

Traveling Gavel. It was first used by Most Worshipful Grand Master Laddie Wilson in 2013 to close the Grand Lodge session and then used to install Roy Etherton as Most Worshipful Grand Master.



Tennessee State Traveling Gavel

The gavel may be used at any Masonic function where a gavel is required. In order for a lodge to claim the gavel, three members of a lodge must attend a meeting where the gavel is located and request it be transferred, or a lodge that is in possession of the gavel may present it to another lodge.

Greeneville came into possession of the gavel when it was presented to lodge member and Most Worshipful Grand Master Billy Ray Cutlip. The gavel was officially turned over to Greeneville Lodge No. 3 by Joe Byrd of the Grand Lodge of Tennessee Education Committee at the November stated meeting.
