

T.J. Luttrell

ix members of Greeneville Council
No. 77 Select Masters have served
the state at the highest level – Most
Illustrious Grand Master.

Thomas Jefferson Luttrell was born in Greene County at the onset of the War Between the States. Active in local business and politics throughout his life, Luttrell died just after the outbreak of World War II.

Luttrell was very active in all the local Masonic bodies and served the state as Most Illustrious Grand Master of Cryptic Masons in 1927.

During his Grand Master's Address delivered in Nashville on Jan. 23, 1928, Luttrell said, "The year to me, in many respects, has been a very pleasant one, and I shall always cherish the memory of this year and the honor you have bestowed upon me."

Luttrell also said, "At the time you elected me to this high office I tried in my feeble way to express my thanks for the great honor conferred, and now, as I close my report, I again desire to express my sincere appreciation of the honor of being permitted to advance to this exalted position. I have endeavored, in my feeble way, to promote the interests of the Order."

As fate, fortune, or coincidence would have it, Luttrell and the four other Most Illustrious Past Grand Masters from Greeneville who have passed on are all buried within a matter of feet from each other at Oak Grove Cemetery.

The following was printed as a memorial in the Proceedings of the Ninety-Second Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of the State of Tennessee (Jan 26, 1942):

Thomas Jefferson Luttrell was born (on Aug. 4, 1861) in Greene County, Tennessee, and died at his home near Greeneville on December 24, 1941, following a very brief illness. He was

buried with Masonic honors in the Oak Grove Cemetery on Dec. 27.

He is survived by his wife (Florence); one sister, Mrs. John Kirk of Greeneville, and several nieces and nephews.

He received his education in the schools of Greene County, and when a young man he moved to Greeneville, where he was active in the business, political, and religious life of the city for the remainder of his life. He was engaged in the mercantile and banking business, served as County Court Judge and a member of the City Council, and was active in the Asbury Methodist Church for more than fifty years.

He was raised in Greeneville Lodge No. 3 on November 27, 1895, and served as Worshipful Master in 1921.

He was exalted in Greeneville Chapter No. 135 on December 15, 1896, and served as High Priest in 1925. He was anointed in the Holy Order of High Priesthood at Nashville in January 1925.


He was greeted in Greeneville Council No. 77 on May 23, 1918, and served as Thrice Illustrious Master in 1923.


He was knighted in Greeneville Commandery No. 20 on February 15, 1906.

He was initiated in Kerbela Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S., at Knoxville.

He was a charter member of the Eastern Star Chapter in Greeneville.

He was elected Grand Steward of the Grand Council on January 29, 1923, and advanced each year thereafter, being elected M.I. Grand Master on January 24, 1927.
