# **Commandery Orders**

The Commandery Orders consist of three degrees, Order of the Red Cross, Order of Malta, and the Order of the Temple. The Commandery Orders are unique to Freemasonry in the fact that they do not refer to Ancient Craft Masonry. This provides a new direction of thought and experience. Every Christian Mason should join the Commandery of Knight Templar in order to complete their Masonic journey.

The first degree of the Commandery is the Order of the Red Cross. The focus of this degree is the importance of keeping one's word. It foreshadows the words of Jesus "I am the Way, the TRUTH, and the Life." The degree follows the story of Zerubbabel's admission into the Jewish Council at Jerusalem and his appearance at the court of King Darius. Important questions are asked "Which is greater? Strength of wine? The power of the King? Or the influence of woman?"

The second degree of the Commandery is the Order of Malta. The candidate in this degree represents a knight about to depart for the Crusades in the Holy Land. In this degree the candidate is created a Knight of Malta and the important symbol is the Maltese cross. This degree is intended to be preparatory for the Order of the Temple.

The third and final degree of the Commandery Orders is the Order of the Temple. This degree centers around the candidate, a Knight of Malta, seeking admission into the Valiant and Magnanimous Order of the Temple. After reflection, the candidate is presented with a series of thought provoking questions for which he must answer. To test his faith, the candidate is sent on several years of Pilgrimage. After proving his faith, the candidate assumes a solemn obligation.

As a test of his courage and constancy, the candidate is given a certain number of years of warfare. After the completion, the knight is granted into the Asylum of Knights Templar where he participates in a memorial



followed by a reading from the New Testament.

Lastly, the candidate must perform a year of penance in token of his humility. Following this, the candidate seals his fate in one of the most solemn and impressive ceremonies in all of Masonry and is duly dubbed a member of the Valiant and Magnanimous Order of the Temple.
