
We all know Freemasonry is a family. I believe Greeneville Lodge No. 3 is a shining example of how the family gets put into our fraternity.

Royal Arch Chapter



The Royal Arch Chapter degrees consists of four degrees. The scene is set during the time of the construction phase of King Solomon's Temple. The four degrees are Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master, and The Royal Arch.

The first degree of the Royal Arch Chapter is the Mark Master degree. This degree takes the Candidate back in time as Fellowcraft working in the quarry. This degree emphasizes the lessons of regularity, discipline, and integrity.

The second degree of the Royal Arch Chapter is the Past Master Degree. Ancient custom required that a Mason must be a Past Master of his Blue Lodge before he could be exalted to the Royal Arch. Therefore, this "virtual" Past Master degree was created in order to maintain that ancient tradition. This degree emphasizes the lesson of harmony.

The third degree of the Royal Arch Chapter is the Most Excellent Master degree. This degree takes the Candidate to the completion and dedication of the Temple. In



this degree, the Candidate gets to witness the consecration of the Sanctum Sanctorum and the descent of the Host into the Temple. This degree is complimentary to the Mark Master degree and emphasizes the lesson of reverence.

The final degree is The Royal Arch degree. This degree explains the origins of the Substitute Word found in the Master Mason degree of the Blue Lodge. In this degree, witness the recovery of the Ineffable word. The presiding body is a Chapter and the presiding officer is a High Priest titled Excellent.
