## More Light

any of the Greeneville Lodge members can remember when the current Greeneville Masonic Lodge was purchased from Brother Howard White, who recently passed earlier this year. The building was purchased on December 12, 1974. The location was originally a hardware store.

After Greeneville Lodge obtained the new property, massive renovations had to be conducted to get the Lodge Hall into shape. A kitchen had to be put into the downstairs dining hall. Bathrooms and other various projects had to be added or fixed.

Remnants of the original hardware store are still visible today if you look hard enough for them. The most obvious is the outside of the building where the large windows were boarded up. You can also see where the windows have been blocked from inside the Lodge room.

Greeneville Lodge is much like all of us, it is getting older everyday. Work and renovation



still needs to be taken care of to keep our lodge in top shape. The Lodge recently suffered from an infestation of termites. The termites did some damage throughout the building, but particularly the downstairs kitchen area. Hopefully a visit from pest control has remedied that situation.

On brighter news, with the help of the Lodge and the Masonic Bodies, new lights were purchased and installed into the Lodge room. Again, remnants from the old hardware store were left to light the building. The new lights, pictured above, were purchased from Brother Harold Hartman. Brothers Royce Peterson and Joe Byrd installed them.

The new lights certainly look much nicer than the old flourescent tube bulbs that filled the Lodge room. The antique chandelier fixtures add a bit of sophistication and really help set the mood in Tennessee's oldest active masonic Lodge.
